The Scriptures remind us that the cross of Christ has to be reckoned with. We become Christians because of the cross; we experience and know forgiveness of sins because of the cross; we become new “creations” because of the cross; and when we live out our Christian witness to our Lord it is done through a glad taking up of the cross and following Him in mission. This cross is utter reality and the Church continues to be salt and light when she remains faithful to her crucified Lord. If she is tempted to stray from the sphere and claim of the cross she has not only stopped

being light and salt in the world, but has also refused the One who asks for that kind of sacrifice, surrender and obedience.
